DAY 1: ARRIVAL TRANSFER AIRPORT/ /KANDY (105 K.M, 2.30 HRS)

Met on arrival at the Bandaranayke International airport by the Heritance Holidays Representative on arrival and transfer to Kandy. Lunch will be provide on the way. Kandy was the last capital of the Sri Lankan kings, which is a world heritage site. The name Kandy conjures visions of splendor and



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In Kandy, do a city tour. Kandy was the last capital of the Sri Lankan kings, which is a world heritage site. The name Kandy conjures visions of splendor and magnificence. Many of the legends, traditions and folklore are still lovingly kept alive. Drive around the Lake built by the last Sinhala king Sri Wickrama Rajasinghe in 1798. Visit the Kandy town and Bazaar, the arts & crafts center and a gem museum and a lapidary.

In the evening witness a cultural show featuring traditional Sri Lankan dancing followed by a visit to the Kandy Temple of the Tooth Relic

Check in at Mahaweli Reach Resort / Similar for Dinner and overnight stay.

DAY 02: KANDY/PERADENIYA/ PINNAWELA/BENTOTA / KALUTRA

After early breakfast leave to visit the Botanical Gardens at Peradeniya which has been first built as a pleasure garden by a Sinhala king and was expanded by the British. It is 147 acres in extent and provides an amazing variety of trees, plants and flowers.

Next visit the Pinnawela to visit the Pinnawela Elephant Orphanage which is the home for about 60

elephants, out of which many are baby elephants found abandoned or orphaned in the wild. They are being cared, fed and trained by the wild life authorities. The best time to visit is during the feeding times, when one will have the opportunity of seeing the baby elephants being bottle-fed. Also, you could accompany the elephants to a river close-by and see the elephants having their daily bath.

Continue to Bentota a beachside town located on the southern coast of Sri Lanka.

Continue to Bentota and check in at Cinamon Bay Resort / Similar for Dinner and overnight stay.



DAY 3: BENTOTA/MADU RIVER/TURTLE HATCHERY/GALLE/BENTOTA

Breakfast at Hotel. Take the river cruise along the Madu Ganga, the estuary of the Madu Ganga River is a complex coastal ecosystem of mangroves and islands. It may be one of the last remaining tracts of pristine mangrove forests in Sri Lanka.

The boat trip is a wonderful way of seeing some of the hundreds of species of plants and animals monkeys eat fruit in the trees, a water monitors lizard glides slowly through the water, and cormorants, egrets and kingfishers wait patiently on the banks, eyeing the water for prey.

There are around 64 islands in the river and lagoon, from a tiny speck housing a deserted shrine to one housing 250 families connected to the mainland with a very long footbridge.

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The main occupations of the local inhabitants are producing cinnamon and prawn fishing - if you take the trip in the evening you will see the fishermen in their canoes lighting lanterns to attract the shellfish into their traps. Also visit a turtle hatchery.

Transfer to Galle and do a city tour of Galle, which was once the chief port of Ceylon, as Sri Lanka was named by the British. It is still well known for hand-made lace. You can also visit the

Galle Fort (spanning 90 acres), which was originally built by the by the Portuguese and later extended by the Dutch in 1663 which is a world heritage site. See its beautiful Lighthouse. The name Galle was derived from the ancient Sinhala word 'Gala' which means overnight parking of bullock carts and other vehicles

Return to hotel for Dinner overnight stay.



DAY 4: BENTOTA/COLOMBO

Breakfast at hotel. Later check out and proceed to Colombo.

On arrival in Colombo and do a city tour of Colombo. Colombo like many capital cities in developing countries it is fast changing its face. Almost overnight, skyscrapers arise from where old buildings once stood. Yet in some parts, the Old-World charm is retained. As an example, there is a 100-year-old clock tower and several British built colonial buildings. Other places of interest are the Pettah bazaar where one can shop for bargains, the old Parliament in Fort, a Hindu and a Buddhist temple, residential areas where you find the stately homes of the affluent and the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall - BMICH, an outright gift to Sri Lanka from the People's Republic of China.

Check in Cinamon Lakeside Resort Colombo / Similar for dinner and overnight stay
